ATTENTION MUSHROOM HUNTERS

Mushroom hunting is allowed on Fort Riley only in areas that are designated as "open" for non-consumptive pursuits. All persons recreating in a Training Area on Fort Riley must check in and out of the area on a daily basis. Check in-out must be done through the Fort Riley iSportsman website (https://fortriley.isportsman.net). Individuals will need to register on the site, if they don't have an account already. Open areas are listed on that website or by stopping by the Environmental Office, Building 407, Pershing Court. Those persons not having access to a personal computer or mobile device, can access the iSportsman website at a public terminal provided at the Visitor's Control Center, exit 301, I-70.

All individuals 16 and older must possess a Federal ID Card or a Fort Riley Access Pass or badge to recreate on Fort Riley. Individuals who do not already have the required ID or Access Passes can apply for one at the installation's Visitor Control Center (Bldg. 885), located just south of the Henry Gate Access Control Point (Exit 301, U.S. Interstate 70) Monday through Friday from 5 a.m. to 11 p.m. and 7:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. on weekends and federal holidays. Access Passes are based on the requirement of the visit.

During the time period (Sept. 1 – May 31), all recreationists in the field who are not in a stationary position must wear at least one of the following articles of visible, external apparel with at least 50 percent of its surface area solid blaze orange in color: hat, cap, vest, coat, jacket, sweatshirt, shirt or coveralls.

All vehicles used during recreation must have a Fort Riley Recreation Motor Vehicle Permit prominently displayed in their front windshield. The permit is free of charge and can be found at the Visitor's Control Center, information stations on Fort Riley, or on the iSportsman website. Failure to obtain a Fort Riley Recreation Motor Vehicle Permit or entering an area not designated as "open" for non-consumptive recreation may result in immediate suspension from the fort for up to 60 days.

Fort Riley Outdoor Recreation Maps can be obtained at the information stations, the Environmental Office, building 407 Pershing Court, or at the Visitor's Control Center.
