Fort Riley Non-Hunting Recreation Access Facts Sheet

The military mission has precedence over recreational activities. The Fort Riley Military Reservation or portions of it may be closed at any time due to military activities. Vehicle access may be prohibited where recreation is allowed. Additional security measures may be implemented without notice, resulting in restrictions in addition to those explained in this publication.

Eligibility: Anyone possessing the required documents and able to follow all of the rules specified below is eligible to recreate on Fort Riley. Additional rules and regulation are in effect for hunting, trapping, and fishing activities. Please see the appropriate section of the Fort Riley iSportsman website and Fort Riley Regulation 210-15 for more information on those activities. All required permits must be available to show to game wardens upon request.

Fort Riley iSportsman Permit. A Fort Riley iSportsman permit and daily check-in-out is required to recreate on Fort Riley. To obtain an iSportsman permit, recreationists must have registered and completed the Outdoor Recreation Safety Brief online at https://fortriley.isportsman.net. This briefing is available under the "My Account" tab after logging in. The safety briefing and acquisition of iSportsman permit and vehicle pass is required to be completed annually.

Open Areas: Recreation in Fort Riley's training/maneuver areas is limited to those listed as open on the Fort Riley iSportsman website. Individuals are responsible for understanding the open areas listing daily when logging into iSportsman. The impact area and Douthit Range Complex are off limits at all times.

Vehicle Pass: All vehicles used during recreation must prominently display a Fort Riley vehicle pass in their front windshield. The vehicle Pass and iSportsman permits are free and available to print on the Fort Riley iSportsman website after watching the current year Outdoor Recreation Safety Briefing.

Hunter Orange Requirement. From September 1 - May 31, all recreationists not in a stationary position must wear at least one of the following articles of apparel with at least 50 percent of its visible surface solid blaze orange in color: hat, cap, vest, coat, jacket, sweatshirt, shirt or coveralls.

Access Control Procedures: Individuals 16 and older must possess a Federal ID Card or a Fort Riley Access Pass or badge to recreate on Fort Riley. Individuals who do not already have the required ID or Access Passes can apply for one at the installation's Visitor Control Center (Bldg. 885), located just south of the Henry Gate Access Control Point (Exit 301, U.S. Interstate 70) Monday through Friday from 5:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. and 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. on weekends and federal holidays. If you know the exact date of your visit, it is highly recommended to get a temporary pass or badge early by stopping by the Visitor Control Center.
