

FORT RILEY PRE-DEER SEASON FACT SHEET 2018

The military mission has precedence over the announced hunting season. The Fort Riley Military Reservation or portions of it may be closed at any time, without prior notice, due to military activities. Additional security measures may be implemented at any time without notice, resulting in access restrictions in addition to those explained in this publication.

1. PERMIT REQUIREMENTS

a. Fort Riley 2018-19 iSportsman Permit. Each deer hunter regardless of age must complete the 2018-19 iSportsman Briefing online at <https://fortriley.isportsman.net>. Your Fort Riley iSportsman Permit must be printed from your iSportsman account upon completion of the briefing and must be in your possession while hunting.

b. Required Kansas Permits and Licenses. Each deer hunter must obtain all permits and licenses required by the state of Kansas **INCLUDING** a Fort Riley Hunting Access Permit (if required as described in the iSportsman Briefing). Kansas Permits and Licenses are available at County Clerk Offices, any Kansas Hunting and Fishing License Vendor, or over the Internet at <http://www.kdwpt.state.ks.us/news/license-permits>. Fort Riley Hunting Access Permits are available online at <https://fortriley.isportsman.net>. State of Kansas resident deer permits are scheduled to become available beginning August 1, 2018.

c. Fort Riley Deer Hunting Permit.

c.1. Each deer hunter regardless of age must complete the Fort Riley Deer Hunting Briefing online at <https://fortriley.isportsman.net>. This briefing must be completed each year. Your Fort Riley Deer Hunting Permit must be printed from your iSportsman account upon completion of the briefing and must be in possession while hunting.

c.2. Fort Riley **Firearm** Deer Hunting Permits will be unlimited and online at <https://fortriley.isportsman.net> beginning 20 August 2018.

c.2.1. Fort Riley **Archery** Deer Hunting Permits will be unlimited for all Active Duty Military hunters stationed at Fort Riley. Those permits will be available online at <https://fortriley.isportsman.net> beginning 20 August 2018. Dependents of all Active Duty Military hunters stationed at Fort Riley who PCS to Fort Riley after 18 August 2018 will also have an unlimited number of permits available in person at the Fort Riley Environmental Division Office.

c.2.2. Fort Riley **Archery** Deer Hunting Permits will be issued first come, first served to a maximum of 200 hunters who are not included in para c.2.1 above and will be available **only** at the Fort Riley Environmental Division Office **beginning at 7:00 a.m., Saturday, 18 August 2018 until 3:00 p.m.** *Note: A parent or guardian of a minor hunter (i.e. hunter under the age of 18) may acquire a first come; first served Fort Riley Archery Deer Hunting Permit for the minor hunter provided the minor hunter will hunt at all times with the parent or guardian.* **Individuals desiring a first come; first served Fort Riley Archery Deer Hunting Permit after 18 August must reference the Fort Riley iSportsman website “Home” page (<https://fortriley.isportsman.net>) for other permit allotted times.**

c.2.3. All individuals who obtain a Fort Riley **Archery** Deer Hunting Permit will automatically receive a Fort Riley Firearm Deer Hunting Permit for the seasons they qualify to hunt, as defined below.

2. SEASON OPTIONS: Final season dates will be published in the Final Fort Riley Deer Fact Sheet, which will be published around July 1st. Fort Riley's season structure will likely consist of the following:

Youth/Disability: September 8 – 16 & October 6 – 8, 2018

Traditional Muzzleloader: September 17 – 30, 2018

Archery: September 17 – December 31, 2018

DOD ID Card Holder Firearm: November 23 – 25, 2018

Regular Firearm: December 15 – 23, 2018

Extended Antlerless: January 1, 2019

Special Archery-Only Season: September 1 – 16 & January 2 – 31, 2019 (Must Qualify)

3. BAG LIMIT and TAGGING INSTRUCTIONS: The bag limit for white-tailed deer on Fort Riley is consistent with the state of Kansas. Fort Riley falls into Deer Management Unit 8 for Kansas. Each deer harvested must be immediately affixed with a valid Kansas deer tag per Kansas Regulations.

4. FIREARM & ACCESS SPECIFICS: Fort Riley Regulation 190-1 requires that **ALL** firearms brought on-post be registered with Fort Riley. Firearms must be registered regardless of military or civilian status. Firearms may be registered at the Visitor Control Center, building 885, right off exit 301, I-70, Marshall Army Airfield.

NOTE: A National Crime Information Center (NCIC) level III check will be conducted on all visitors wanting access to any part of the installation. For additional questions contact the Visitor Control Center at (785) 239-2982.

5. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

Access Control Procedures:

All individuals 16 and older must possess a Federal ID Card or a Fort Riley Access Pass or badge to recreate on Fort Riley. Individuals who do not already have the required ID or Access Passes can apply for one at the installation's Visitor Control Center (Bldg. 885), located just south of the Henry Gate Access Control Point (Exit 301, U.S. Interstate 70) Monday through Friday from 5 a.m. to 11 p.m. and 7:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. on weekends and federal holidays. Access Passes are based on the requirement of the visit.

If you know the exact date of your visit, it is highly recommended to get a temporary pass or badge early by stopping by the Visitor Control Center. Any questions can be answered by calling (785) 239-2982 or emailing usarmy.riley.imcom-central.mbx.des-vcc@mail.mil. You will be required to provide a government issued photo identification.
