

FORT RILEY SPRING TURKEY SEASON 2019

The military mission has precedence over the announced hunting season. The Fort Riley Military Reservation or portions of it may be closed at any time, without prior notice, due to military activities. The use of vehicles to access all or portions of the post where turkey hunting is allowed may be prohibited during all or parts of the turkey season. Additional security measures may be implemented at any time without notice, resulting in access restrictions in addition to those explained in this publication.

ATTENTION: FR 190-1 (*Fort Riley's Control of Privately Owned Firearms, Weapons, Explosives and Ammunition*), and Fort Riley Regulation 210-15 (Hunting, Fishing, Trapping and Outdoor Recreation) are available for viewing on the Fort Riley iSportsman website (<https://fortriley.isportsman.net>). **It is your responsibility to read and understand all applicable regulations for hunting on Fort Riley.**

Violations of FR 210-15 may incur suspension or revocation of Fort Riley hunting/outdoor recreation privileges, monetary fine or both. **KNOW THE REGULATIONS** contained in this fact sheet and in the Fort Riley Outdoor Recreation Map and Regulations summary before recreating on the installation.

1. **ELIGIBILITY.** All Kansas residents and non-residents who possess the required permits are eligible to hunt the spring turkey season on Fort Riley as specified below.

2. PERMIT REQUIREMENTS

a. **Kansas Permits and Licenses.** Each turkey hunter must obtain all permits and licenses required by the state of Kansas. Kansas Permits and Licenses are available at County Clerk Offices, any Kansas Hunting and Fishing License Vendor, or over the Internet at <http://www.kdwpt.state.ks.us/news/license-permits>. Turkey hunters hunting on Fort Riley will need a State of Kansas Unit 3 turkey permit/game tag.

b. **2019-20 Fort Riley iSportsman Permit** (No cost). Each turkey hunter regardless of age must complete the 2019 Outdoor Recreation Briefing online at <https://fortriley.isportsman.net> and then obtain the 2019-20 Fort Riley iSportsman Permit at that website. Go to the "My Account" tab on the webpage and you can take the Outdoor Recreation Safety Briefing video and quiz there. Your Fort Riley iSportsman Permit must be available to game wardens for viewing while hunting/scouting.

c. **2019 Fort Riley Hunting Access Permit** (\$25). Most hunters must possess a 2019 Fort Riley Hunting Access Permit. The Permits are available online at <https://fortriley.isportsman.net>. Exemptions include Persons < 16 or ≥ 65 years of age; Kansas Disabled Veterans (30% or greater disability or a KDWPT Exempt license).

d. **Fort Riley Spring Turkey Hunting Permit** (No cost). Each turkey hunter regardless of age must complete the 2019 Spring Turkey Safety Briefing video online at <https://fortriley.isportsman.net> and then obtain a 2019 Fort Riley Spring Turkey Permit at that website. Fort Riley Spring Turkey Permits will be made available **beginning March 13, 2019**. Go to the "My Account" tab on the webpage and you can take the Turkey Safety Briefing video and quiz

there. Your Fort Riley iSportsman and Spring Turkey Permit must be available to game wardens for viewing while hunting/scouting.

3. SEASONS

(1). **Youth & Disabled Season, 1-16 April 2019.** All Fort Riley Spring Turkey Permit holders who qualify as a Youth or Disabled hunter as defined by Kansas regulation may hunt in any open shotgun/archery area. Those persons supervising or mentoring youth hunters must watch the video as well.

(2). **Archery Only Season, 8-16 April 2019.** All Fort Riley Spring Turkey Permit holders may hunt during the archery season in any open shotgun/archery area with any allowable archery equipment, as defined by Kansas regulation.

(3). **Regular Spring Turkey Season, 17 April through 31 May 2019.** All Fort Riley Spring Turkey Permit holders may hunt during the Regular Spring Turkey Season.

4. **OPEN HUNTING AREAS:** Fort Riley Spring Turkey Hunters are eligible to hunt in any training or maneuver area open for shotgun/archery hunting. Spring Turkey hunters are responsible for checking the open areas listing on a daily basis to ensure availability of open hunting areas.

5. **BAG LIMIT.** Fort Riley falls into Kansas Turkey Management Unit 3. The legal bag limit is one bearded turkey per Kansas Turkey Management Unit 3 Permit and one bearded turkey per Kansas Turkey Management Unit 3 Game Tag. No more than one permit and one game tag may be obtained for Unit 3. Individuals possessing both a Kansas turkey permit and Kansas turkey game tag may harvest both birds in one day.

6. **HUNTING PROCEDURES.** Fort Riley hunters must use the automated web check-in-out system found here: <https://fortriley.isportsman.net>. If you need assistance in registering or using the system please contact the Environmental Division Office. Upon registration and after taking your outdoor recreation and turkey hunting safety video quiz, you will be able to check-in/check-out on a daily basis using any personal device with internet access 24 hours a day. Fort Riley iSportsman registration and daily check-in-out is required to recreate in Fort Riley's Training Areas.

7. **HARVESTED TURKEYS.** All hunters harvesting a turkey on Fort Riley **are required** to complete the turkey harvest portion found on the automated Fort Riley iSportsman check-out portion. Information requested will include location of kill, length of turkey's beard and length of turkey's spurs.

8. **LEGAL METHODS OF TAKE.** Shotguns (with shot sizes #2 thru #9) and legal archery equipment (as defined by Kansas Regulation) are allowed for turkey hunting.

9. **OFF-LIMITS AREAS.** The **IMPACT AREA** and **Douthit Range Complex** are **OFF-LIMITS at all times!** Areas not listed as open for shotgun/archery hunting on the Fort Riley iSportsman website (<https://fortriley.isportsman.net>) are **NOT** open for turkey hunting.

10. **FIREARM SPECIFICS.** Fort Riley Regulation 190-1 requires registration of **ALL** firearms brought on-post with Fort Riley. Firearms must be registered regardless of military or civilian status.

Firearms may be registered at the Visitor Control Center, building 885, right off exit 301, I-70, Marshall Army Airfield.

NOTE: A National Crime Information Center (NCIC) level III check will be conducted on **all visitors** wanting access to any part of the installation. For additional questions contact the Visitor Control Center at (785) 239-2982.

In addition, FR Reg.190-1 prohibited practices include:

a. Carrying concealed on one's person any weapon. Kansas concealed carry handgun permits and those issued by other states are **not** recognized on Fort Riley.

b. Firearms being transported in a vehicle must be unloaded and out of the reach of the occupants. If there isn't a location out of the reach of the occupants, then the firearm must be unloaded and secured in a closed gun case or disabled with a trigger lock. The intent is that the firearm is not ready for immediate use. Firearms transported on Fort Riley must be secured in the vehicle anytime you stop and leave the vehicle. They may not be taken into public or private establishments and can only be removed from the vehicle at open hunting areas and open ranges. 11. HUNTER ORANGE REQUIREMENT. During the time period September 1 – May 31, all recreationists in a training or maneuver area who **are not in a stationary position must wear** at least one of the following articles of visible, external apparel with at least 50 percent of its surface area solid blaze orange in color: hat, cap, vest, coat, jacket, sweatshirt, shirt or coveralls.

12. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION.

Access Control Procedures:

All individuals 16 and older must possess a Federal ID Card or a Fort Riley Access Pass or badge to recreate on Fort Riley. Individuals who do not already have the required ID or Access Passes can apply for one at the installation's Visitor Control Center (Bldg. 885), located just south of the Henry Gate Access Control Point (Exit 301, U.S. Interstate 70) Monday through Friday from 5:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. and 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. on weekends and federal holidays. Access Passes are based on the requirement of the visit.

If you know the exact date of your visit, it is highly recommended to get a temporary pass or badge early by stopping by the Visitor Control Center.
